Discovery Bible Study DBS (Making Disciples who Make Disciples)

The Process (7 Step = 7 Sets of Questions)

Take turn to facilitate. The facilitator begins with a short prayer to ask God to lead and guide the process. Then the facilitator read the steps and the questions, one at a time. Participants take turns answering each question. The facilitator also answers each question at the end

1. **RECONNECT** (Practice thanksgiving and praying for each other. Ask both questions at the same time. When one finishes answering, the next one prays for him/her, then goes on sharing...)

- What is the one thing that you are thankful for today / this week?
- What is the one difficulty or challenge that you are struggling with, or what is the one thing that you concern for the church or for other people?

2. **REVIEW** (Look back to refresh memory and hold each other accountable for spiritual growth. Do this session from the second time onwards)

- Can someone retell the story from last time?
- How did it go with your "I will ..." statement from last time?
- Did you share what you learned with someone and invite to DBS? What was the response?

3. **READ** (Practice attentive reading. Pay attention to the content of the passage)

• Invite two people to read the same passage two times, one person at a time. (If the group has more than one translation, read the same passage from two different translations).

4. **RETELL** (Practice internalizing and communicating the word of God. Close the Bible before answering the questions in this section.)

- Can one person retell the content of the passage in your own words?
- How about the others, is there anything to add to the content of this passage?

5. **OBSERVE** (Practice engaging in the word; to know God, people/self, and listen. Open the Bible before answering these questions) **see appendix one for hints**

- What does this tell you about God, about Jesus, or about the Holy Spirit?
- What does this tell you about people, or about yourself?
- Which verses from this passage touches your heart? Or What do you sense God speaking to you through these verses?

6. **RESPOND** (Practice immediate obedience in life. Specify what action and when) **see appendix one for hints**

- How would you respond to what God is speaking to you? Or how can you put your learning into action? (Use a notebook, take two minutes to think and write your responses in an "I will..." statement)
- Do you sense God wanting us to do something as a group? (If there is a suggestion, discuss it in the group. If the group comes to agreement, then each one write a "We will... statement)

7. **REACH OUT** (Practice immediate witnessing the words and multiplying disciples) **see appendix one for hints**

- Who and how would you like to share that which you learned today? (Please take notes)
- Who would you like to invite to do DBS with you? (Please take notes)

The facilitator closes the study with a short prayer to thank God for the words given and ask for strength to fulfill the "I will..." and "We will ..." statements, and to witness and invite others to DBS

Appendix One: Hints to Steps 5, 6, and 7

Appendix Two: Suggestions to Facilitators

1.Read the study guide and appendix once and twice before facilitating. If snacks are served do so after the Discovery Bible Study so the group will not be distracted.

2. Each person writes down for themselves:

- I. New insights learned.
- II. The "I will" and "We will" statements.
- III. The "witness & invite" plans.

3. Keep check of the time so all questions are discussed before the time runs out. (Suggestion for time allocation: 20% for steps 1-2, 55% for steps 3-5, 25% for steps 6-7. Allow a few seconds of silence while people are listening to the Lord or while writing in their notebooks. Resist the temptation to jump in to answer your own questions or do so only minimally.)

4. If a member of the group speaks too much, say, "Let's hear what others have to share."

5. If a member of the group goes out of the topic in the text, you may need to bring the group back to the text by asking, "How do you see that relating to this passage?"

6. Make sure everyone has the chance to pray and be prayed for. Keep the sharing in Step One and the prayer short and specific.

7. Keep the group size small (5 people is best). If the group size reaches seven or eight, split into two groups. In preparation for this, take turns facilitating so everyone in the group can grow in skill and confidence in preparation for leading their own groups.

7. When another group is formed, keep in touch with the new group leader to encourage and provide help if necessary.

8. Preparation: Pray for the group before and after the study. At the end of the study encourage the group:

a. To review the passage and think about things they have just learned.

b. Pray for their "I will" and "We will" statements, and for the people whom they plan to share with and to invite to DBS.

Appendix Three: Scripture Groupings for Two Years

If you lead a congregation, you may have your own set of passages or be following a lectionary. Alternatively, the Bible is rich with options and the following are only suggestions and could be explored in almost any order. The passages which follow, if a group met weekly, would guide the group for two years. During that time, it is likely the group will have started other groups. These groups can then also pick topics at their own pace.
