What might be “Kingdom greetings” (cf. Matt 10:12; Luke 10:5-6) which can help identify a person of peace?

Experiment. Listen to the Lord. Be bold.

Pray at start of each day to meet a person of peace, for the Lord to give you eyes to ‘see’ them, even for those who will ask you a question revealing their spiritually open heart.

Prayer Walking...

Say hello. Engage in conversation.

Tell people you are out meeting people in the community and praying for needs in Jesus' name.

Tell people you believe in the power of prayer and the God of all miracles.

Ask, "If God could work a miracle in your life, what would it be?" If they respond with a need, pray on the spot for that miracle in Jesus' name.

Learn more of their story / ask questions...

After praying, follow up with a question, "Do you consider yourself to be near to God or far from God?"

If they respond, ask more questions to briefly discover their story and the reason(s) why they feel close to or far from God.

Share your story & Jesus story

Once you learn their story, share your story.

You can ask, "Can I share the best thing that has ever happened to me?" (or first, "What is the best thing that has ever happened to you?")

As a part of your story, share the gospel message with them.

Inviting person of peace to follow Jesus.


